We are proud to announce that following their training with Healthy Minds NHS, our Y6 Wellbeing Champions are ready to share their new skills with the children of Tealby School.

They have been trained to:

- understand what is meant by mental health and wellbeing
- know and suggest strategies that support mental health and wellbeing
- use active listening skills - children can talk things through or rehearse what they want to say to an adult with a Wellbeing Champion before coming to tell an adult
- know when to tell an adult - they will support children to take that step and tell a trusted adult what is on their mind
- be familiar with a range of people they can signpost their peers to.
- Support other children to use breathing and calming techniques if they are worried about things
- Ensure that everyone knows about who/where they can share their worries – for example, the Worry-Monsters in the Well-being area.
- Be excellent Playground Buddies and look out for their younger peers during break times.

They are supported in school to undertake this role by Mrs Haslam and Mrs Humberstone.

On Monday they are delivering their first Assembly with the whole school to introduce themselves



and their roles. They have planned, prepared and practised as a group to make sure that they are ready to go... watch this space!
