



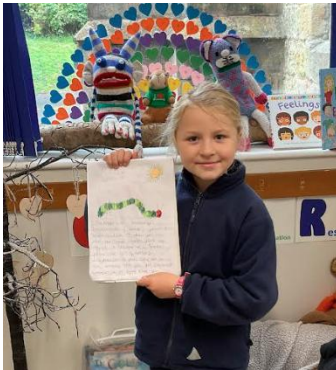

We are incredibly proud of our pupils who have been demonstrating Tealby School's values through creativity, leadership, and kindness.

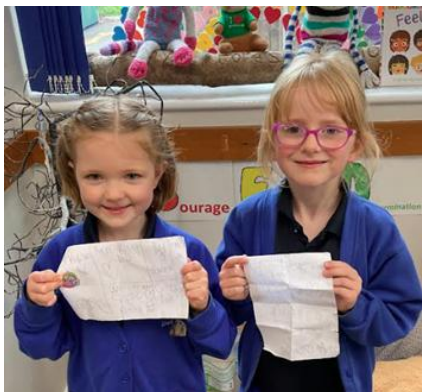

Well-done to Charlotte who has earned her 5 meters swimming badge this week! Look how proud she is!



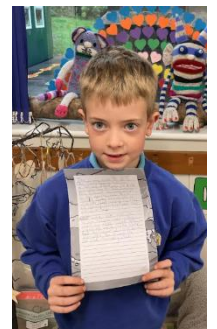
Mia competed in a horse-riding event and won four rosettes! Just brilliant!

Harry's writing this week was so good that he earned a special purple slip for excellence – well done Harry, keep it up.





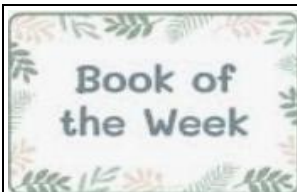
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KS2: Paper Dragons: The Fight for the Hidden Realm

Fast-paced, full of action and fun, Paper Dragons takes you on a journey which, while entirely fantasy fiction, delves into Chinese culture, folklore and cuisine.
