Egg-tastic Winners

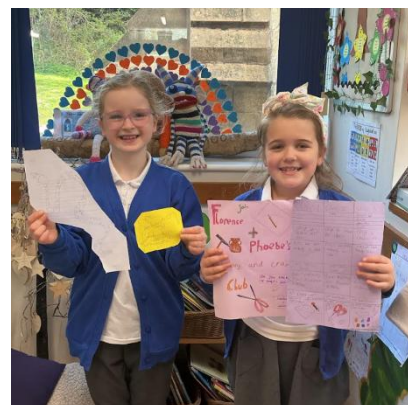
It's been another year of eggcellent entries!

Respecting School Processes and Boundaries



We would like to remind all parents and carers of the importance of following the school's agreed communication procedures when raising concerns or discussing school-related matters.

Approaching other children or their families on the playground, at the school events, or outside of school to address issues is **not appropriate**. This includes questioning, challenging, or attempting to resolve matters directly with another child/family. Such actions can cause distress, escalate situations, and may be viewed as inappropriate or intimidating. All concerns relating to school matters must be raised through the proper channels.

The correct process is to:

- Speak to your child's class teacher by arranging an appointment
- If necessary, escalate concerns to senior staff
- Follow the school's formal complaints procedure where required

Our priority is to maintain a safe, respectful environment for all pupils. By working together and following the correct procedures, we can ensure that issues are managed appropriately and positively for everyone involved.

Lincolnshire County Council: targeted support for households reliant on heating oil

In March, the UK Government announced that it would provide targeted support for households reliant on heating oil who are facing financial hardship because of the increase in heating oil prices and, as a result, are at risk of losing immediate access to heating or hot water.

The funding is being provided to areas with high levels of households reliant on oil as a top-up to the previously announced [Crisis and Resilience Fund](#) (CRF) and on behalf of Lincolnshire County Council, will be administered locally by the Lincolnshire Community Foundation.

As a result, eligible households will receive a £300 prepaid off-grid energy voucher. If the household has no means of receiving an electronic voucher, alternative methods will be explored on a case-by-case basis.

To qualify, households must:

- Have a below average income (under £36,000 combined household income)
- Have savings of less than £6,000 after the cost of oil
- Not be on a mains gas supply and use heating oil as the primary fuel for heating and/or hot water
- Be at risk of losing immediate access to heating or hot water due to a lack of heating oil
- Be able to pay the difference between the voucher value (£300.00) and the full cost of the heating oil, including delivery

Applications are now being accepted via the [Crisis and Resilience Fund: Heating Oil Support Scheme](#) –



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[Lincolnshire Community Foundation](#) and are limited to one per household.

Applications will be processed as soon as possible, with an aim to determine eligibility for complete applications within 2 working days, subject to demand and the complexity of supporting evidence.
