In Class 1 we have our own cloakroom area; this is in our classroom.

In the cloakroom we each have a peg with our name on it. We hang our coats, spare clothes and lunch bags on our pegs.



We keep our wellies in the slot underneath and our water bottles in the holders at the top. We keep our book bags in our drawers.

We try to keep the cloakroom tidy.

The toilets are in the corridor just outside our classroom.
