Class Four

In Class 4 lately we have been making motorized cars. We have been looking at toy cars and seeing what the features are. We have also been making circuits. We measured pieces of wood and then cut them to the right length, using the saw. Then we used a hot glue gun to stick the pieces of wood in a rectangle.

Next, we got card triangles and stuck them on the sides, the triangles have holes in them so later on we could put the axle through them. Then we cut another piece of

wood and stuck it across the middle of the rectangle.

Next, we got an elastic band and two card triangles and slid them on the axle, then we put the axle with the wheels attached through the triangle with the hole in it. Then we glued the motor and its hold onto the middle wooden piece and the batteries in their holder on the back.

Finally, we made a circuit that would make the car move, we took the cars outside and took part in a mini car race.
